I have been an active SCI member for over 22 years with extensive SCI committee experience (Groups: Environment, Health & Safety – Past Chairman; British Carbon – SCI representative; Governance: PAC, FIAC, MAC – past Chairman, BoT - Trustee). I devised, implemented and led the process used to recruit the current Executive Director. I am one of the youngest Trustees and recipient of the SCI Lampitt Medal.

Good communication, financial and person management skills are core to my role at Imperial College. I have significant experience of managing a research group, a large laboratory and multi-million pound research projects (having personally secured funding from industry/government).
