I have also taught on chemistry summer schools for the Open University, and with Johns Hopkins University at Baltimore in the USA from 2004-12.

My qualifications include, B.Sc.(Science), B.Sc. Hons. (Applied Chemistry), PGCE (Secondary teaching, chemistry), M.Sc. (Analytical Chemistry), and CChem (Chartered Chemist).

The Board of Trustees (the 'BoT') needs more members who are active in the Society at Group level. My current involvement with the Society is as follows: Honorary Librarian (2011 to date); Honorary Secretary, London Regional Group Committee (2012 to date); Ordinary Member, Horticulture Group Committee (2012 to date). Ordinary Member, Finance and Investments Advisory Committee (the 'FIAC', 2015 to date). I organise lectures and industrial visits for the London Regional Group, and regularly attend SCI meetings.
