


Candidates Nominated for Election at the 135th SCI Annual General Meeting

I have over 30 years experience as a manager and consultant in the chemical industry, and as an active Member of SCI. For SCI Canada 1998 - 2004, I organised six successful Annual Awards events and the Centennial Conference. I served on MDAC and Awards Committee (now Early Career Support Sub-Committee). Currently I serve on MAC, Agrisciences, Science & Enterprise, Energy, and Yorkshire & the Humber Group committees. As Chair of SEG until 2015, I founded the Energy Group. I was involved in organising several events including the Y&H Group Annual Awards event and several conferences for SEG and ASG.

I have a wealth of experience in strategic planning and implementation, and a deep understanding of the options to achieve business growth and development. If elected, I would work with PAC Chair to propose and implement strategies for Publications that would provide value for SCI's Members. A key factor for success will be how best to manage, grow and utilise SCI's publications / media assets. In particular, I will bring forward proposals to increase circulation of C&I to promote SCI's brand and to generate revenue enabling SCI to invest in resources needed to implement its strategies for growth and development.
