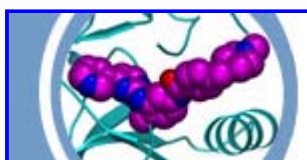


[Polymeric Biomaterials](#)

Joe Schwarcz to receive the Purvis Memorial Award

This award is given for major contribution to development and implementation of strategies, which have resulted in the strengthening of Canadian industry or academic or research institutions in the field of chemistry.

Joe Schwarcz is Director of McGill University's Office for Science and Society, an office dedicated to demystifying science for the public, the media and students. Joe has developed practical chemistry courses, with an emphasis on health issues and on applications of chemistry to everyday life. His informative and entertaining lectures deal with many topics ranging from the chemistry of foods and the chemistry of love to the science of ageing. Through his many books and articles and his television and radio appearances he captivates audiences with his explanations of the mysteries of chemistry. 'Dr Joe' is an outstanding educator, an engaging communicator and an enthusiastic spokesperson for chemistry as a science. He will be the keynote speaker at the Awards Dinner to be held on Thursday, 25 March 2010, at the Hyatt Regency Toronto, Canada.
