Preparing for applications



 There is usually a contact – speak to them



- If there is no contact, make one
 - "Follow" company on LinkedIn
 - LinkedIn Alumni tool
 - LinkedIn Field of Study explorer



Use their knowledge to inform your application





Application Style

Contact details (as for CV)





Date

Dear Dr. XXX [Madam or Sir],

Subject line, including job reference

Single page only

Why this? Why are you interested? Whom have you spoken to? What work are you doing at the moment?

Why them? What have you seen that makes you want to work for this firm? Prove that you've done your research.

Avoid gushing!



Why you? How do you meet the job description? Reference what is required, and explain why you have the skills. What don't you have to offer?




