I have over 30 years experience as a manager and consultant in the chemical industry, and as an active Member of SCI. For SCI Canada 1998 - 2004, I organised six successful Annual Awards events and the Centennial Conference. I served on MDAC and Awards Committee (now Early Career Support Sub-Committee). Currently I serve on FIAC, Agrisciences, Science & Enterprise, Energy, and Yorkshire & the Humber Group committees. As Chair of SEG until 2015, I founded the Energy Group. I was involved in organising several events including the Y&H Group Annual Awards event and several conferences for SEG and ASG.

I have a wealth of experience in strategic planning and implementation, and a deep understanding of the options to achieve organisational growth and development, as well as the critical importance of reputation. If elected, I would work with the BoT to propose and implement strategies that would provide best value for SCI's Members going forward. A key factor for success will be how best to develop technical and regional groups, brand and media assets in support of strategic objectives. Accordingly, I will support proposals to increase income to enable SCI to invest in the resources needed for growth and development.

I strongly believe in a vision in which SCI leads and influences thinking by bringing a science-based approach to issues of critical importance to society and business: water, food, energy and materials. This implies engaging with government and other stakeholders to influence policy.
