Synopsis

The management of contaminated land involves identifying risks arising from the presence of contaminants, in order that appropriate action can be taken.

The risk assessment of a potentially contaminated site requires information to characterize the contamination status. This information is gathered by a process of site investigation as set out in this standard.

This event is intended to present a background to the development of the comprehensively revised and updated standard; how the revised standard was developed and then what has significantly changed in the standard? After three seminars in 2010 to discuss the DPC, over 2000 comments were elicited on the first draft. All of these comments were then considered by the Steering Board and if appropriate modifications made. This significantly revised and updated 137 page BS 10175 standard will provide comprehensive guidance to aid the investigation of all potentially contaminated sites.
