Engagement of, and participation of, TIGs is seen as critical and significant effort has been made to communicate with TIGs on the significant value to them of SEG activities. In advance of each event, opportunities for TIGs are highlighted and pathways to encourage attendance are devised. The Chairman and Treasurer attended the Fine Chemicals TIG in July 2009. In addition, the Chairman and Alan Baylis had discussions with leaders of a number of the TIGs, including Colloids & Surface Chemistry, Electrochemistry, Separation Science & Technology, Health and Safety and BioResources. There was much interest in sustaining good lines of communication, sharing of best practice and exploiting ideas, events and intelligence for mutual value.

The Chairman attended the SCI Committee Officers' Training Day on 28 September 2009 and notes have been circulated to core committee members.

Committee Meetings and Events

The Group was launched on 22 January with an evening reception attended by some 50 people from SCI and diverse organisations.

The first committee meeting was held on 14 May 2009 with Peter Reineck acting as Chair. The second committee meeting (teleconference) was held on 29 June 2009 and the third was on 7 September 2009.
